



Indiana Alcohol & Tobacco Commission Announces DST Service Hours

INDIANAPOLIS (March 12, 2021) – The Indiana Alcohol and Tobacco Commission announced that it will allow the sale of alcoholic beverages on Sunday, March 14, 2021, to continue until 4:00 a.m.

Daylight Saving Time changes clocks to 3:00 a.m. at 2:00 a.m. and without an additional hour, alcoholic beverages sales would need to cease at that time. To allow the same number of service hours on Saturday night, the ATC is again allowing the sales of alcoholic beverages to occur until 4:00 a.m.

Please check with your local unit of government to ensure they have not implemented any time-restriction ordinance due to the public health emergency.

The Indiana Alcoholic Beverage Commission was created by an act of the Indiana General Assembly in 1933 following the repeal of Prohibition. Effective July 1, 2001, the name was changed to the Alcohol and Tobacco Commission (ATC). The ATC is composed of four members appointed by Governor Eric J. Holcomb and houses the Indiana State Excise Police, who are responsible for enforcing state laws related to alcoholic beverages and the rules of the ATC.
